

SK8 SKOOL

Sk8 Skool is our 'longer' term program where we introduce skateboarding in a fun, positive, and engaging way. Punch cards with different tricks and progression levels are provided as skills advance. With Sk8 Skool, we focus on developing the hard skills of skateboarding as well as soft skills such as confidence, determination, creativity, and

leadership.

Since April 2023, we've roughly served

48 youth

through our Sk8 Skool program.

SK8 KAMP

Sk8 Kamp is a 1-5 day camp where we introduce skateboarding in a fun, creative, and interactive way. Youth get the opportunity to paint and design their very own skateboard, learn the functionality of the skateboard, participate in a workshop centered around skateboard culture, and learn basic skateboard tricks.

This year, we've been able to host our Sk8 Kamp at 3 different locations:

- Angel Guardians
- Wighlander
- Burke Bigh Teen Center





In 2023, 33 students got to design and keep their own skateboard through Sk8 Kamp.

DEMOS

Our Demos are 30min showcases intended to ignite excitement and foster a genuine interest in skateboarding culture among youth. Ramps, music, and local skateboarders from the community are brought in to show off their skills, producing an exciting introduction into skateboarding.

In 2023, we did 2 demos serving roughly 500+ students, staff, and parents.

Our partnered events are how we reach out to the community and introduce skateboarding to a larger audience. Whether it's setting up an SF information booth, hosting our fingerboard design workshop, or providing ramps and skateboards for people to try out (Mini Sk8 Skool)—either way, we love engaging with the community and spreading the positivity of skateboarding and creativity.

CADEN'S




CORNER


Caden's Corner is a resident-led and community-driven pocket park featuring a ramp, garden, mural, and picnic tables. This park was designed and built by the community for free public use.

BACKSTORY:

In the summer of 2023, we had the opportunity to collaborate with local resident group, PlaceMade, in creating a ramp and garden at the intersection of Florence Blvd and Pratt Street, adjacent to King Science Middle School and Kountze Park.



The ramp's mural was brought to life by The Union for Contemporary Art's Action Brigade Youth, with local artist Oria Simonini guiding and overseeing the artistic process.







Furthermore, we sought the expertise of local urban farming groups, Manifest Acres and Healing Roots African Diaspora Garden, to assist in plant selection and lead the charge during our volunteer planting day.

As the ramp neared its completion, a local mother who lost her 14-year-old son in a recent car accident reached out with a desire to both give back to the community and honor her son's memory. The young boy, Caden, had a love for skateboarding. Recognizing Caden's passion, we collectively decided to name the park in his honor, creating a tribute that will carry forward his legacy and love for skateboarding.









Caden's mother also
decided to hold a
fundraiser to provide
skateboards and helmets to
the neighborhood youth in
Caden's honor. Through
fundraising, Caden's
mother secured the
necessary resources for 40
skateboards and 40 helmets
for the neighborhood's
youth.

Presently, the ramp is open from dawn to dusk for the community to freely use. We host Sk8 Skool sessions at this location every Saturday morning from 9 to 11 a.m. for neighborhood youth and others wanting to learn how to skateboard. (when the weather permits)


